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- 3.1 10 Human beings developed differentiation of their consciousness over very long time periods. One way of doing this was to create artistic expressions of their observations of inner and outer experiences of the natural world, including themselves, using any viable outer materials (stone, earth, plant, animal, etc.). Whilst developing the faculty of memory by recording the past, human beings were also forming consciousness which embraces continuity in relation to repeated inner and outer experiences during interaction with the natural world and each other. 16.2 70 'Physicality' refers to the mineral, corporeal nature of human incarnation, as distinct from 'vitality', without which the *physical body* cannot exist.

16.2 71 *Consciousness or spirit soul* is the part of the human soul which can know (recognise) truth through activity of a consequent and responsible human '*I*' which is imbued with individualised spirit leadership. Existentially the loneliest part of the soul; where thoughts, concepts, ideas, empathy, discrimination, judgement are experienced as spiritually alive; where the contextual exercise of prayer, contemplation, meditation and truth are realised and perceived as a spiritual reality.

Important here is to understand the simultaneous juxtapositioning of two perspectives, i.e. two experiential tendencies of the soul in relation to the 'threshold of death':

- a) incarnation into the physical realm (see 3rd paragraph in 16.2);
AND
- b) excarnation into the spiritual realm (see 4th paragraph in 16.2).

The 'threshold of death' should be understood here as referring primarily to the threshold between:

- a) 'normal waking consciousness' (incarnation)
AND
- b) 'normal sleeping consciousness' (excarnation);
whereby the latter state can be transformed into 'spiritual consciousness', e.g., systematic meditative practises.

Thus by...

- a) consciously penetrating 'physicality' of body
AND
- b) consciously differentiating the 'astrality' (see ref. 72) of soul,
- including their respective 'environments' -

these complimentary processes establish conditions for birthing human '*I*' activity, which itself promotes growth of 'spiritual consciousness' in the soul.

The development of *consciousness or spirit soul* is the prerequisite for the progressive anchoring in the soul of the higher members of the spiritual constitution of the human being in both the states of incarnation and excarnation.

16.2 72 The term 'astrality' refers to a supersensible light-bearing 'substance' which both interconnects and constitutes the discreet *astral bodies* of every ensouled entity, including incarnated and excarnated human spirits;

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16.2 72 it is a primary component of human soul organs, as well as being a medium which is associated with carrying and mediating a wide spectrum of soul experiences, e.g., passions, desires, emotions, feelings, sentience, dreams, impressions, perception, awareness and thought-forms.

17.1 76 The term 'biographical axis' refers to the erection of a 'column' for the '*I*' at a particular moment, generally a biographical node, on a Life Line, through which experiential phenomena radiating from such a column can be explored, according to relevant methodological guidelines.

17.2 77 In Edition Biographæa the human '*I*' is clearly distinguished from the ego as defined above (see ref. 59). The Spiritual Individuality of a human being incarnates in the soul through the developmental activity of the '*I*', which is phenomenologically incident throughout life.

The archetypal moment when the autonomous activity of the '*I*' anchoring itself in the soul moves into the ascendant is at 42 years.

The experience of the '*I*' can be characterised as being consciously in alignment with the source of truly emancipated self-awareness in the human soul.

17.2 78 *Spirit self* refers to that member of spiritual constitution which can emancipate a human being from physical-soul compulsions by purifying and ennobling the *astral light body* (see ref. 52) through '*I*' activity in the soul.

Simultaneously the *spirit self* is capable of initiating spiritual direction, i.e., leadership of the soul and body through the '*I*'.

In so doing the *spirit self* becomes individualised by the human '*I*', as does the human '*I*' in turn so attain immortality through such communion with the *spirit self*.

Comparisons of *spirit self* with terms like Higher Self and Eternal Spiritual Individuality are explored further in Edition Biographæa.
